Michael graduated from Valparaiso (Indiana) University. He was awarded Degrees of L.L.B and L.L.M. from Georgetown University, Washington, DC.

In 1905, Michael was appointed as Clerk in the Office of the U.S. Treasurer. He later became the Superintendant of the National Redemption Agency.

In 1917, Michael saw duty as a Lieutenant in the Chemical Corp. His military Serial Number: O-111167. Michael was a member of the American Legion, George Washington Post No 1 of Washington, DC. Michael retired as a Major in the US Army reserves.

Michael was a member of the District Bar in Washington, DC., admitted to practice befor the U.S. Supreme Court; spoke 7 languages. Michael was a graduate of the American Institute of Banking.

In 1936, Michael was named Administrative Assistant to the U.S. Treasurer which led to his assignment as Deputy & Acting U.S. Treasurer.

In June 1949, Michael was appointed by President Truman as acting Treasurer of the United States. He succeeded the late William A. Julian who died in May 1949, in an automobile accident. As the ranking civil service employee of the Treasury Department, he was to serve not to exceed 30 days. He declined appointment as permanent treasurer, due to his pending retirement.

On 30 December 1950, Michael retired from Federal Civil Service, following more than 45 years service with the Treasury Department. After his retirement he spent summers on the Slindee farm north of lawler, winters were spent at Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

On 30 September 1957, Michael died from a cerebral hemorrhage, St. Joseph's Hospital at 9:20 AM. The funeral services provided by Perry Chapel (\$971.90); New Hampton.

Two persons (Military) accompanied the body by Great Northern & Pennsylvania Railroad, to the Hines (Rinaldi) Funeral Home

(\$315.00), Silver Springs, Maryland. Michael was buried on 4 October 1957, at Arlington National Cemetery, Section 2, Grave 3580-LH; with Modified Military Honors, including body bearers, firing party & bugler, with a Lutheran Minister officiating at Ft. Myer Chapel, followed by Masonic rites.
