General Notes (Husband)

Peder was born in Norway, January 25, 1844, the son of John and Julia (Peterson) Johnson, who came to the United States in 1847, when their son Peter was but three years of age. With his parents and three siblings, Peder boarded the Statsrad Vogt at Bergen on 7 May 1848. After a voyage of two months they arrived in New York City on 5 July 1848. The "History of Dane County", records that "the family came at once to Dane County, settling in Blooming Township".

Peter Johnson was educated in the primitive country schools of that early period and remained upon the home farm until October 1, 1864, when at the age of twenty years he enlisted in response to the call of his adopted country for military aid. He became a member of Company B, Fifteenth Wisconsin Regiment, which was wholly composed of Norwegians. The command went south and served under Sherman, taking- part in the celebrated march from Atlanta to the sea. Mr. Johnson received his discharge April 1, 1865, and returned to his home in Wisconsin, where he spent the succeeding four years.

In December, 1869, Peder removed to Chickasaw County, Iowa, driving through with team and wagon. He was accompanied by his brother Tollif (Tolaf) and together they purchased two hundred and forty acres of land from John Badgley and later built a blacksmith shop on the corner where the Jerico Tavern later stood. This was the very first business building and the beginning of the town of Jerico. A division of their landed interests was then made, Peter Johnson taking one hundred and twenty acres, which forms a part of his present home farm that now comprises one hundred and sixty-five acres. He has lived continuously upon this farm for a half century and probably not another settler in Jacksonville township has remained for so extended a period upon one farm.

On the 24th of June. 1870, Mr. Johnson was united in marriage to Miss Martha Attleson, a daughter of Atle Attleson, who came to Chickasaw county from Dane County, Wisconsin, in 1862. Mr. and Mrs. Johnson became the parents of twelve children- nine of whom survive, namely: John, who operated the home farm; Ed ward, an agriculturist of Jacksonville township; Peter a lumber dealer residing at Willow City, North Dakota; Gilbert, who served in the European war and as an assistant cashier of a banking institution at Humboldt, Iowa; Grover, who also served with the American forces in the great World war; Sarah, who married Martin Johnson, of Dane County, Wisconsin; Martha, the wife of Carl Offerdahl, of Mount Horeb, Wisconsin; Anna, who resided in Madison, Wisconsin; and Hattie, at home.

In his political views Peder Johnson was a democrat and for four terms he filled the office of township assessor of Jacksonville Township. He was also for several terms a member of the township board of trustees and for a number of years served on the school board. He and his family were members of the Lutheran church and are people of genuine worth, their many sterling traits of character winning for them warm regard. Peter Johnson certainly deserved much credit for what he has accomplished, as his success came to him as the direct reward of earnest labor. Not only was he the owner of a valuable farm property but is also a stockholder in the Jerlco Creamery Association. Long residence in Jacksonville Township brought him a wide ac-acquaintances and he numbered among her prosperous and valued citizens. It is ironical that their family stones at the Crane Creek Lutheran Cemetery contain the name of "Ellestad" rather than their chosen name of Johnson.

On 6 September 1891, Peder sponsored the Baptism of Mildred Bertina Johnson (Aunt of the compiler of this family history.)

In January 1920, Peter and his wife were living with their son John P. Johnson
