

NHT PA-4 Jerry A. Felder 1-25-00

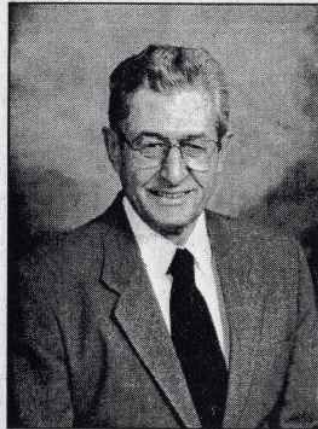
ALTA VISTA – Jerry A. Felder, 70, died Friday, Jan. 21 of kidney failure at North Iowa Mercy Health Center in Mason City.

Funeral services were held at 11 a.m. on Tuesday, Jan. 25 at St. Bernard's Catholic Church in Alta Vista with Rev. Roger R. Rethamel, Rev. Vince Rosonke and Rev. Steve Rosonke presiding. Pall bearers and gift bearers were Jerry's granddaughters, Erika, Toni Jo and Annie Felder. LaVerne Cerwinski was lector. Organist Sara Recker accompanied the St. Bernard's Men's Choir. Vocalists were Ed Crawford and Jean Cerwinski.

Inurnment was in Mount Calvary Cemetery at Alta Vista with Robert Hilsman, Kelly Mishak, Jeff Elenz, Jim Peters, Don Recker and Vince Nuebel serving as casket bearers. Visitation was held after 4 p.m. on Monday, Jan. 24 at Conway Funeral Home in Elma where there was a 4:30 p.m. Rosary and a 7 p.m. Scripture Service and also for an hour before services at the church.

Jerry A. Felder was born May 12, 1929 at Alta Vista, the son of August and Anna (Delsing) Felder. He attended St. Williams School and was married Sept. 21, 1950 at St. Bernard's Church to Delores Mishak. They resided in Alta Vista all their married life. Jerry was a member of St. Bernard's Church and of the Men's Choir. He had served as chief for the Alta Vista Fire Department and had been a city councilman. He was an
