Death of Frank Hardenbrook

Mr. Frank A. Hardenbrook died at his home in Metz, Sunday morning at about 1:45. He had been seriously sick but five days, heart trouble being the cause of his sickness.

Mr. Hardenbrook was born in Iowa thirty eight years ago and has lived in Jasper County nearly all his life. His wife's maiden name was Sarah E. Miller, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George W. Miller, of Metz. Besides his wife, he leaves five children, two boys and three girls, all between the ages of seven and seventeen. One brother, Orin, lives in Texas.

Mr. Hardenbrook was highly respected by all who knew him and his death will be mourned by a large number. The funeral was held yesterday afternoon. October 1909.

Frank Hardenbrook was born near Newton, Iowa, July 20, 1871, and died at his home in Metz on October 24, 1909. He married Sadie E. Miller, March 11, 1891. Five children: Evan, Elsie E., Ethel, Georgia and Frank M., whom with their mother survive. He also leaves a younger brother, Ormand, of Keechi, Texas. Mrs. Hardenbrook Dies at Skiff Hospital Today

Mrs. Sarah Hardenbrook, 79, died at 5:35 this morning at Skiff memorial hospital following several years of illness. During the past two weeks her condition became more critical.

The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George W. Miller, she was born in a log cabin in the Metz vicinity, and had spent her entire life in Jasper county. Following her marriage Mar. 11, 1891, to Frank A. Hardenbrook, a railroad agent for the C.R. I and P Ry. Co. they made their home in a house built upon the site of her birth.

Mr. Hardenbrook died 38 years ago and a daughter, Ethel Gibson died 25 years ago. After the death of her daughter she made a home for here three grandchildren, Margaret, Elma Mae and Frances Gibson.

She is survived by two sons, Evan Millison Hardenbrook, Frank McKee Hardenbrook, two daughters Mrs. Dolar (Elsie) Huff all of Newton and Mrs. F.L. (Georgia) Logsdon of Des Moines, 14 grandchildren and 18 great-grandchildren, and two brothers, Melvin Miller and C.I. Miller and two sisters, Mrs. Elmer Emmack and Mrs. W.H. Brock all residing near Newton.

Mrs. Hardenbrook was a teacher prior to her marriage. She was a member of the Methodist church, of the Good Samaritan class of that church, the W.S.C.S. and had been active in past years in Newton Bible Class. She was a member of the Daily News Three-Quarter Century Club.

Funeral services will be held from the First Methodist church at 2 p.m. Wednesday with Dr. E.A. Briggs officiating. Burial

Mrs. Gibson Answers Call
Has Been Seriously Ill Only Two Days
Funeral Arrangements Not Announced

Mrs. John Edgar Gibson died today noon at 12:45 o'clock after only a few days illness. Death was due to diabetes. Mrs. Gibson has been in failing health for some weeks but she was not taken seriously ill until Monday.

Ethel Hardenbrook was born in Metz 28 years ago and lived there until 10 years ago when she was married to John E. Gibson. To this union three children were born.

Mrs. Gibson leaves besides her mother, Mrs. F. A. Hardenbrook, with whom she had made her home for the past four years, a husband and three small daughters, Margaret, 9; Elsie May, 7; and Frances, 5, and her two sisters, Mrs. Elsie Huff, Georgia Logston, and two brothers, Evan and Frank Hardenbrook.

Mrs. Gibson Buried Friday
Short Service Held at Home -- Body Then
Taken to Church at Metz.

Funeral services were held yesterday afternoon for Mrs. John E. Gibson. The funeral was held from the residence at 1 o'clock and from the Baptist church at Metz at 2 o'clock. Mr. Charles B. Hankins, pastor of the Methodist Episcopal church at Newton was in charge of both services. Burial was made in the Metz cemetery.

Ethel Frances, the daughter of F. A. and Sadie Hardenbrook was born near Metz, Iowa, March 24, 1894. Her early childhood was spent in the Metz vicinity where she grew in womanhood.

On March 24, 1912 she was united in marriage to John E. Gibson. To this union were born three children, Margaret, aged nine years, Elsie Mae seven years and Frances five years, all of whom remain to mourn the death of their mother.

Mrs. Gibson was a faithful attendant at the Sunday school. While she was but a child she united with the Baptist church at Metz, Iowa, of which church she remained a faithful member to the day of her death. She was a loving and devoted wife and mother -- always sacrificing for the pleasure and comfort of those around her. She will be greatly missed by all her friends.

She never possessed rugged health, but she abounded in the Christian virtues. She was very kind to all and was exceptionally kind to her father, who suffered for so long a time and preceded her to the other world on October 24, 1909. She was always ready to put her all in the hands of God. She never questioned His ways. She had a sweet disposition manifesting concern for others under every circumstances.

Mrs. Gibson was ill only three days. Her final summons came on Wednesday, October 11, 1922, being aged at the time of her departure 28 years, 6 months and 17 days. She leaves to mourn her death her husband and three children mentioned above, her mother, Mrs. F. A. Hardenbrook, two sisters, Mrs. Elsie Huff and Mrs. Georgia Logsdon; two brothers Frank and Evan, all of whom were at her bedside during the last moments of her life, a number of more distant relatives and a large circle of friends. ~ The Newton Daily News, October 14, 1922.
