Mrs. Chas. A. Herbold, 48, of Newton, died Friday night at the Skiff hospital, as a result of accidentally taking paris green earlier in the day.

The poison was taken by mistake about 2 p.m. and it was not found necessary to call a doctor until 8 p.m. She was immediately taken to the hospital where she died at about 10 p.m.

Mr. and Mrs. Herbold were known in this community having resided several years in the Goddard vicinity. They lived 1 1/2 miles northeast of Newton. She had been a deaf-mute for a number of years.

Funeral services were conducted from the Toland funeral home in Newton Sunday afternoon with Dr. W. H. Blancke, officiating.

Mrs. Laura Herbold, daughter of Casper and Sophia Menning was born at White Lake, S. D. Aug. 24, 1887, and died Friday night at the Skiff hospital in Newton.

Mrs. Herbold's death was the result of accidentally taking paris green Friday afternoon. She was believed to be color blind. Surviving relatives are her husband; three sons, Roy of Vinton and Glen and Howard of Newton, a brother, William

He attended country school in the Newton area and served in the U.S. Army 3rd Armored Division in Normandy, Northern France and throughout Central Europe during World War II. On Feb. 2, 1946, he married Alice V. Masters in Wathena, Kan. He worked as a machinist and foreman at Maytag Company and retired in 1979. He was a member of First Lutheran Church and served as an usher and delivered service tapes to shut-ins. He was a member of RSVP, Jasper County Historical Society and Jasper County Senior Citizens. He also was a member of American Legion Post 111 and a lifemember of VFW Post 1655.

Survivors include a son, Hal Herbold of Des Moines; a daughter, Valli Herbold Childers of Columbia, Mo.; one grandson; a half-sister, Charlotte Alexander of Theodosia, Mo.; and a sister-in-law, Irene Herbold of Newton.
