James Harvey Hickman, 79, pioneer Jasper county farmer, died this morning at 3:20 o'clock at the Skiff Memorial hospital, following an illness of influenza which later developed into pneumonia. Funeral services have not been arranged, pending word from relatives.

Mr. Hickman was born in Winchester, Ind., in 1852, son of Samuel and Martha Hickman, and came to Jasper county when thirteen years old. He had lived on a farm near the Oak Ridge school for the last 46 years.

Sad Death at Council Bluffs Was a Shock from Which She Could Not Recover

Mrs. E. H. Phillips died at four o'clock yesterday afternoon, having suffered a three weeks' illness of typhoid fever and complications. She was not very well and strong and the terrible shock she received by the death of her youngest son, Ira, who was run over and killed by a train in the yards at Council Bluffs five weeks ago, was more than her loving mother heart and weak body could bear. The first week after the terrible accident, through her sorrow was very great, she seemed to bear the trouble remarkably well, but from the time she was taken seriously ill with the fever, she seemed to think she would not recover, and did not care to get well.

Mrs. Anna Hickman was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Hickman, whose home was west of Newton. She was married to Mr. E. H. Phillips twenty-two years ago. They resided for a number of years west and north of town, but for fourteen years have lived in Newton.

For some time their home has been on North Morrow street in west Newton, where her death occurred.

She has long been a member of the First Baptist church and was of a modest retiring disposition, being a great home woman.

Besides the husband, she leaves one son and a daughter, Roy and Agnes, and four brothers, Harvey Hickman, who resides west of town, Ramsey Hickman, of Pender, Neb., who arrived last evening after his sister had passed away, Milton Hickman, living in Illinois, and Eli Hickman of Canada.

B. F. Hickman died at the home of sister-in-law, [acutally his aunt] Mrs. C. J. Hickman, of Metz, Thursday afternoon at 3:15 o'clock. The funeral will be held from the Metz school house tomorrow, Sunday, at 2:30 o'clock. The interment will be in the Metz cemetery.

Mr. Hickman had been sick with pneumonia about two weeks.

Last October he received a wound on the head by being struck while crossing the Rock Island track, by a beam that was fastened to a flat car. For this he received \$150 as settlement on February 27, 1906.

After the accident Mr. Hickman spent a month or two with relatives in Nebraska, and when he returned home, he said he felt that he was as well as he had ever been. ~ The Newton Daily News, March 17, 1906.

Died of Pneumonia

Benjamin F. Hickman, after an illness with pneumonia for about two weeks, died last Thursday afternoon, Mrch 15th, at the home of his aunt, Mrs. Cal. J. Hickman in Metz.

It will be remembered that Mr. Hickman was the victim of a strange accident about five months ago. While standing at the railroad crrossing in Metz, a beam reaching out from a car belonging to a work train on the Newton & Northwestern, struck him on the head, inflicting a very painful wound. but fortunately not a dangerous one.

Deceased was about forty-two years old and a brother of Mrs. Ed. Phillips of this city. The funeral was from the Metz school house at 2:30 o'clock Sunday afternoon and the interment was in the Metz cemetery. Rev. R. F.
