DIED YESTERDAY AT AGE OF 81 YEARS

After many months of sickness and several years of ill health, during which time he was unable to look after business with his accustomed care and attention., A. J. Westbrook passed away, yesterday afternoon at 2 o'clock at his home three miles southwest of Newton. His body was simply enfeebled by old age and he passed out of sleep into death.

The deceased was among the older and better known residents of Jasper county. He and his wife came to this county in 1864 -- immediately after the war. They came here with Hiram Westbrook, the deceased's father, who was at that time a retired farmer. The deceased had volunteered in Ohio, but after a few months' service in the war was released on account of disability.

The deceased was born September 30th, 1833, near Sparta, Ohio. Mr. Westbrook was married to Livona Swetland in 1860. In 1864 Mr. and Mrs. Westbrook came to Jasper county and settled on the farm southwest of Newton, where they have lived ever since. After becoming incapacitated, Mr. Westbrook's son, W. S., moved into a house in the same yard as his father and he and his wife have taken care of the couple.

The deceased leaves his life companion behind and two sons -- two sons, Edward and Stanley, having died as children with diphtheria. Surviving sons are: A. S. of Aberdeen, Idaho: Charles, of Oskaloosa: Burr, of Texas, and W. S. on the old home farm. A brother, Lee Westbrook of ?ty, and a sister, Mrs. C. B. Jones of Nebraska, also survive.

The son, Charles was for many years associated with Bert Miller in the dry good business here under the name of Miller & Westbrook. He is now engaged in the business in Oskaloosa.

The store is in the same room formerly used by Harvey Skiff as a drug establishment, and the people of Jasper County have been buying their drug supplies out of there for the past quarter of a century.

Mr. Burr Westbrook has been in the drug business for a great many years, having for a long time conducted a store in Monroe in partnership with Ralph Parmenter. Not being satisfied to remain in Monroe he removed to Newton, where the opportunities were greater. Soon the partnership with Mr. Geise was formed and Burr received a lucrative position on the road traveling for a paint company, where he has secured a high standing as one of the best paint salesmen in the county.

Mr. Ed Geise is a young man who has grown up in Jasper County and has been engaged in the mercantile enterprises ever since he was a boy. He was for a time in association with August Wendt, Sr., in the general mercantile business. After a short time the present partnership was formed, which has been a very successful one, the popularity of the establishment

being a great help.

The stock of drugs and chemicals is supplemented by a full line of paints and oils, and in sundries everything is carried usually found in the first class drug stock. The cigar counter is very popular, and in candies the stock is as fine as can be found anywhere. In the summer season the ice cream trade is very heavy.

Both proprietors are very gentlemanly and popular with the young class of the town, which insures a large trade with them.
