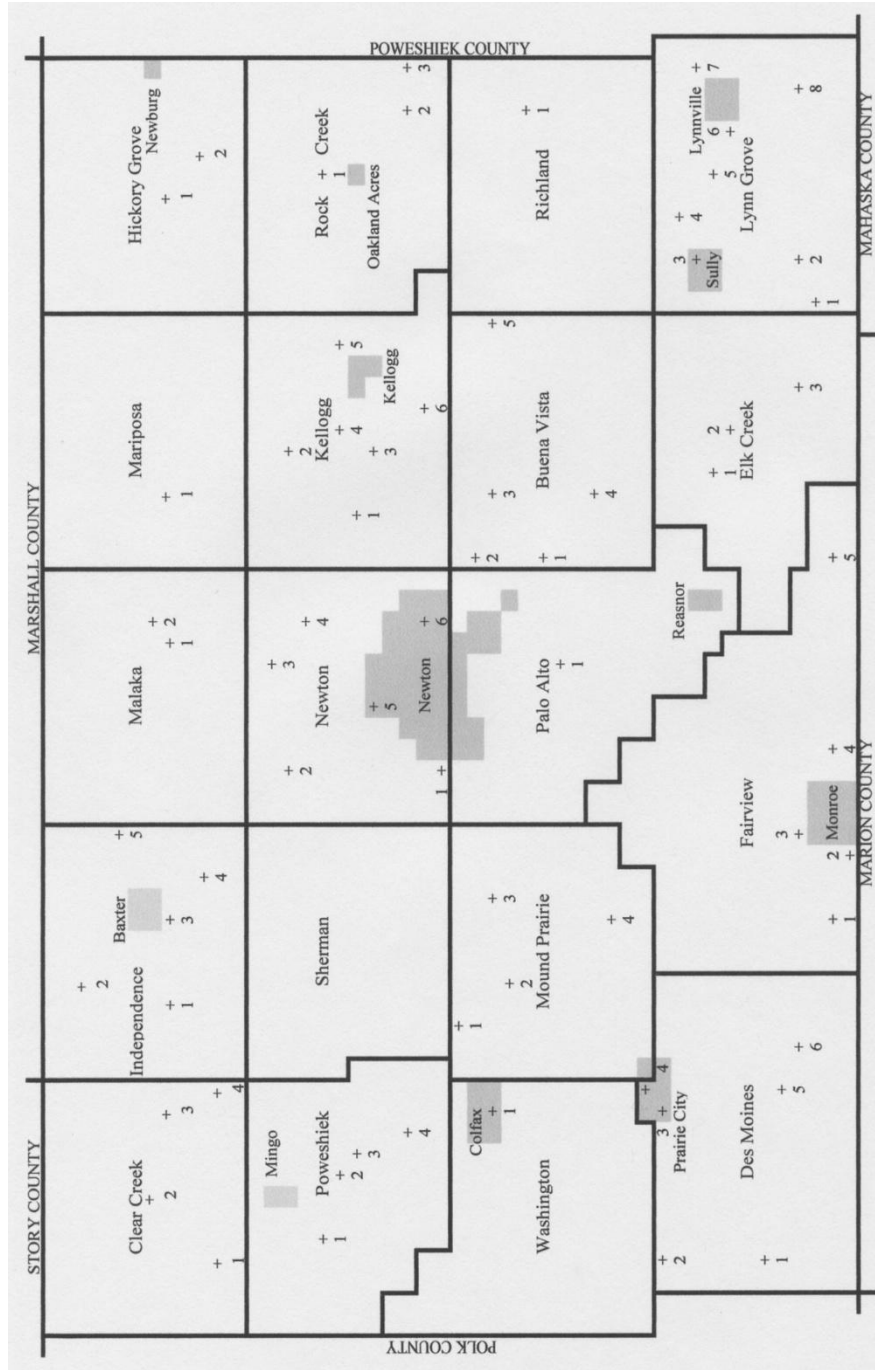

WHERE DID THEY GO WHEN THEY LEFT JASPER COUNTY?

Newton Journal February 13, 1906

Mr. C.C. McConkey Started Tuesday afternoon for Chickasha, Oklahoma, where he intends to make his future home. Chickasha is a splendid place and offers good trade for carpenters. Mr. McConkey being engaged in the carpenter business.

Mr. Hugh Little and son Elmer left yesterday afternoon for Wichita, Kansas for a few weeks stay; from there they expect to go to Chickasha to locate permanently. They have lived in Newton for several years and we regret to loose such a good family. Both parties will send for their families in a short time.

Newton Journal 31 July 1907

Miss Cora Guessford who has been spending a couple months at Wahoo, Nebraska with her brother J.R. Guessford and family, returned home last week. Mr. & Mrs. Guessford have been making their home at Wahoo for the past two years, but have come back to Newton to locate permanently. He is an experienced auctioneer and will follow that trade in this city. We are very glad to welcome these good people into our midst.

Newton Journal 8 May 1907

Mr. H.E. Welch and family will move to Kansas soon. Mr. Welch has been the efficient butter maker at the Creamery for over six years and everybody is sorry to see him leave but the move is made on account of his health.

Mr. & Mrs. Cal Dickson will move to Clemens soon where they will have charge of the Post Office. Mr. Dickson has had charge of the Farmers Elevator here for over a year and at the different times been in business here for a good many years. We are sorry to see them go but the work there will be lighter for them.

Newton Journal 3 April 1907

Lynnville Loses a Good Family

Monday morning, Mr. & Mrs. W. Painter and son Claire whose home was formerly in Lynnville, were passing to Peru, Iowa where they will live permanently.

Mr. Painter was the owner of a drug store in Lynnville, which he sold to Mr. Phelps. Mr. Painter will establish himself in the drug business after locating in Peru. Lynnville loses a splendid family, the removal of Mr. & Mrs. Painter, as they were prominent in both social and church circles of that place. The son Claire was an active member of the Y.M.C.A. at Lynnville and will be greatly missed by the community Secretary Mr. W.H. Babcock and the members of the society.

Newton Journal 6 Feb 1907

Mr. Andy Stewart was in Newton Saturday on business. He seems to be well pleased with his investment at Rockwell City. The farm Mr. Stewart has bought borders on the city line and will give him all the advantages of a residence in the city, he will continue in the stock business. Mr. Stewart and family are among those we regret to see leaving Newton, and can cordially recommend them to the people where they will now make their home.

****Newton Journal: 13 March 1907**

Mr. G.L. Brown and family will in a short time leave Newton for a home in Colorado. They have been good and faithful workers in the Presbyterian Church and as recognition of this fact, a number of the members of that church went to their home to bid them God-speed and to show their appreciation of their work, leaving them with reminders of their Newton friends. Mrs. Brown was presented a Havilland tea set and Mr. Brown a rocking chair. All who knew them will join in hearty good wishes for the future prosperity of this excellent family.

****Newton Journal: 20 March 1907**

Newton Loses a Good Family

Yesterday morning, Mrs. G.L. Brown and three children, Alex, Jean and Mary departed for their new home in southwest part of Colorado, near Durango. Enroute they will visit Mr. Brown's people in Denver. He left Saturday

afternoon to find suitable location for his family. In the departure of Mr. & Mrs. Brown, Newton loses another splendid family who were prominent in both the social and church circles. They formerly resided in a pretty home on Greencastle Avenue, which they sold to Charley Greenlief. The members of the Presbyterian Church to which Mr. & Mrs. Brown belong gave a farewell company for them before they left.

Newton Journal: March 20, 1907

Return from Visit in South Dakota

Mr. & Mrs. J. L. Swearingen and daughter, Miss May, who reside at Killduff, returned Saturday Morning from Turner County South Dakota where they have been spending some time. About three weeks ago they accompanied their daughter and husband, Mr. & Mrs. W.J. Watson and family who were former residents of Killduff to South Dakota, where they now nicely and comfortably located. MR. Swearingen is quite "taken up" with Dakota and says they are having fine weather there. The weather is very healthful and the farmers are preparing to plant their crops. There is quite a colony of Newtonites in South Dakota and Mr. Swearing reports them all being well, happy and contented in their new home.

Newton Journal: 20 March 1907

A Trip to South Dakota

Tuesday morning Messrs, George Woody and Ray Trafton left via the Newton & Northwestern for Aberdeen South Dakota. The boys will possibly remain during the summer and fall seasons, engaged in farm work. They are both anticipating an enjoyable time leading the "genuine western life". Open prairie land and large ranches are the chief attractions, which will be anew life to them for a time. George has been in the Dakotas before and knows something of the ranch life and farm work, but we suspect Ray will soon pick up the western ways and be a ranchman before he gets back.

Newton Journal: 3 July 1907

Emma Robinson a Missionary

She will sail September 11th for Northern India

Among the young men and women of Newton and Jasper County, who are making prominent places for themselves in the worlds work, is Miss Mary Emma Robinson, who with her parents Mr. & Mrs. W.H. Robinson have been living for the past seven years in Monmouth, Illinois, removing there from their beautiful country home, four miles northeast of Newton. Miss Robinson arrived here last Thursday in company with her sister, Miss Belle Robinson, the ladies being guests at the home of their sister, Mrs. Andrew Hans, who reside four miles north of this city.
