Local Students Disclose Places Of Their Birth

Inez Whittaker claims the most unusual birthplace of any Newton High School student. She was born in a log cabin near Niagra, Wisconsin!

"Have you ever noticed Ogle Lee Minear's large ears?" asked Merna Kennedy, "Well, he was born in Missouri." Mildred Lewellen and Margaret Rose Kimmel were born in Missouri too, both in Unionville.

Then there's Isabelle Luther who claims Minnesota; Edith Norris, Wisconsin; Margaret Galuska, Kansas; Mary Logan, California; and Dick DuRant, South Carolina.

Also among native Iowans are Lois Jane Cobbs, Dorothy Ann Castner, Bill Cobbs, and Dorothy Kohloff, who were all born in Lovilia. Roberta Kole and Marcia Livingston came from Monroe; Lawrence Simmons and Phyllis Ann Nelson are from Grinnell.

Clarice Aldridge is from New Virginia, Iowa. "It's a little one-horse town," was her remark as to its location.

Jannetta Coder has lived in Pasadena, California, and has even visited Hollywood. "But Knoxville is a swell place," she'll say as she defends her home town.

Marjorie Farland was born in Killduff and Jean Mudd in a town named Milton which covers about a square inch, according to its daughter.

Jack Paschal comes from Colfax and Marjorie Wormley and Cyril Messenger were both born "at home".

Yet, far or near, Newton itself, is hard to beat as a birthplace say Virginia Jenson, Don Greene, and Kelly Rucker.

A blog is usually one person's thoughts on everything from day-to-day living to very specific topics. The blog appears as a web page, but if you subscribe, the blog will come directly to your e-mail. There are hundreds of blogs on genealogy. The website **genealogy.about.com/** has a nice section on blogs. The following is a summary of genealogy blogs that are favorites of Professional Genealogist, Kimberly Powell. The original article is at http://genealogy.about.com/od/blogs/tp/genealogy.htm.

- 1. <u>Genea-Musings</u>. Randy Seaver's excellent is a representative for the many great personal family history bloggers. His site includes enough of an eclectic mix of news, research processes, personal reflections, and genealogy debate to make it of interest to almost any genealogist.
- 2. <u>The Genealogue.</u> Chris Dunham's unique brand of genealogy humor puts a special spin on just about everything genealogy, from interesting items culled from old newspapers to tongue-in-cheek commentary on current genealogy news and products, to a regular genealogy challenge to keep us all on our toes.
- 3. Ancestry Insider. This "unofficial, unauthorized view" offers current reports, updates and yes, even criticisms, of the big genealogy Web sites especially Ancestry.com and FamilySearch.org. This blog is often the first to report on new updates, products and announcements from the "big" genealogy organizations, and provides the "insider" point of view you won't easily find elsewhere.
- 4. The Genetic Genealogist. Blaine Bettinger helps you add DNA to your genealogy toolkit with his insightful posts on the current and future status of genetic genealogy. His easy-to-read blog, updated almost daily, highlights various genetic testing companies and projects, current news and research, and various tips and resources for people interested in genetic genealogy testing and/or disease gene analysis.
- 5. <u>Boston 1775.</u> If you have any interest in the American Revolution (or maybe even if you don't) this outstanding blog by J. L. Bell is a daily pleasure. The eclectic content covers New England during the time just before, during and after the Revolutionary War, and uses a wealth of information taken from original source documents to discuss how that history has been taught, analyzed, forgotten and preserved. You'll soon be looking at America's early history in a different way.
- 6. <u>Geneablogie</u> by Craig Mason. I have the archetypal American background, being descended from both slaves and slave owners; from Native Americans and prominent (English and French) and not-so-prominent (Scots-Irish) seventeenth century immigrant families. What does that mean for me in the world today? I'm sorting that out.

I have learned much about history, geography, sociology, economics, and other issues as I've gone on this journey. Along the way, I've also picked up a few technical skills, interacted with a lot of folks, found previously unknown cousins, and made some friends.


