The Ashton school board have been having quite a time over the hiring of a principal for their schools for the ensuing year. Being divided between Prof. Roth and Prof. Elliott, of Sanborn. Prof. Elliott offering to accept the position at \$75 per month and Roth refusing to take it for less than \$80 per month, which the board would not pay. They finally hired Mr. Roth, the school district paying him \$700 and one of the members paying him the balance, twenty dollars, out of his own pocket.
