Kimballton — Edna Aagaard was born Febr. 23, 1908 in Clay twp. in Shelby county,daughter of Henry and Clara Aagaard. She was baptized and confirmed in the Elk Horn Lutheran church and has been a life time member. Edna attended the Elk Horn school system. The Aagaard family moved to Colo., for a few years then returned to Elk Horn. Edna worked several years for the Marne Elk Horn Telephone Co., and for several years in Calif. Then she returned to work for her father in the Elk Horn Mercantile. Recently she retired after working at the Salem Lutheran Retirement Home for 13 years. Edna has been very active in church work, directing junior choir, Sunday school teacher and active in the A.L.C.W. and was very interested in all forms of music. Edna died in Denver, Colo., Saturday, Dec. 4, 1976, while on the way to the West Coast to visit her two brothers.
