

Fred D. Allman, 48

Walnut — Lt. Col. Fred D. Allman, son of Jackson F. and Lucille Doolittle Allman, was born Dec. 23, 1932 in Carson and died Wednesday, Feb. 4, 1981, in St. Joseph's hospital, Omaha, at age 48 years, one month and 11 days. He was raised in the Avoca and Walnut areas and graduated from Walnut high school in 1950, and graduated from ISU, Ames. He married Norma Jean Pflugshaupt of Walnut on June 21, 1952 in Walnut.

He entered the Air Force in March, 1955 and retired from there in Nov., 1979. While in the Air Force he received the Meritorious Service Medal with one oak leaf, the Air Force Commendation Medal with one oak leaf, the Air Force Outstanding Unit Award, the National Defense Medal with one star, the Viet Nam Service Medal with two stars, the Republic of Viet Nam Campaign Ribbon and the Bronze Star. He was a member of Peace United Church of Christ in Walnut and was an elementary teacher with the Millard, Neb. school district.

Survivors include his wife, Norma, of Omaha; his mother, Mrs Jack Allman of Atlantic; one son, Randy Allman of Des Moines; two grandsons, Jeremy Scott and Justin Patrick Allman; one brother, Jim Allman of Atlantic; one sister, Mrs Gaylan (Jean) Holst of Griswold, a niece and nephews. He was preceded in death by one daughter, Cynthia Sue Allman.

A memorial service was held Saturday at the SAC Memorial Chapel at Offutt Air Force Base in Bellevue, Neb. Funeral services were held Saturday, Feb. 7, 1981 at Peace United Church of Christ in Walnut, with Rev. Bruno Romanowski and the Air Force Chaplain of Offutt Air Force Base, officiating. Bearers were from Offutt Air Force Base and honorary bearers were Lt. Cdr. Dick Keefe, Brig. Gen. Ed Hines, Jack Nolan, Lt. Co. Fred Freeman, Robert Lafrentz and Richard Elliott. Military honors at the graveside were by Offutt Air Force Base. Burial was in the Walnut cemetery.
