

THE LIFE STORY OF —
**Florence V.
Anderson, 68**

DEFIANCE — Florence Verna Anderson, daughter of William and Mary Beckman Hulsebus, was born Dec. 31, 1908, on a farm in Crawford county. She died at Crawford County hospital in Denison, on Sept. 4, 1977, at age 68 years, 8 months and 5 days. Florence attended school in Defiance, graduating from high school in 1930. After high school, she attended and graduated from beauty school in Sioux City. From 1936 to 1946 she operated her own beauty shop in Defiance. On Aug. 28, 1946, she married Floyd Riebhoff. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Riebhoff made their home on farms in the Algona and Osceola, vicinities.

After she was divorced, she moved to Atlantic, where she operated a beauty shop for a short time before moving to Minneapolis, Minn. On Oct. 14, 1956, she married Palmer Anderson in Minneapolis. They continued to make their home in Minneapolis, where Mr Anderson worked as a carpenter and Florence worked as his secretary and bookkeeper. She was later employed by a Minneapolis area nursing home. After her husband's death in 1971, Mrs Anderson retired and moved back to Defiance. This has been her home since that time. Florence has been active in church activities all of her life and was a member of the Defiance United Methodist church and the United Methodist Women since moving to Defiance. She was also a member of the Willing Workers of Defiance and the Defiance Senior Citizens.

In addition to her father and her husband, she was preceded in death by her brother, Wesley Hulsebus. She is survived by a daughter, Marjorie Hulsebus of Denison; a son, John Riebhoff of Osceola; her mother, Mary Hulsebus of Defiance; a sister, Margaret Hulsebus of Defiance; three brothers - Carl and David, both of Defiance and Rev. Glenn Hulsebus of Ft. Dodge, nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at the United Methodist church in Defiance on Tuesday, Sept. 6, 1977, with Rev. J. Elmer Brunk, pastor of the Defiance United Methodist Church, officiating. Burial was in the Union twp. cemetery in Defiance, with Alfred Nielsen, Lee Ahrenholtz, Pete Ahrenholtz, Louis Ahrenholtz and Edwin Ahrenholtz as honorary casketbearers and Hollis Keele, Harold Benge, Milo Hulsebus, Lloyd Hulsebus, Donald Hulsebus and Willis Ahrenholtz serving as casketbearers.
