Kimballton — Gerald Anderson was born June 4, 1916 in Hamlin twp., Audubon county, son of Raymond and Alma Olsen Anderson. He was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith. He attended Clay twp. rural school. His mother died when he was 10.

On Dec. 15, 1939 he married Mildred Christensen. They farmed north of Kimballton until 1957 when they moved to town. He worked for the Salem Homes in Elk Horn for four years and worked for Morman Feed Co., for 14 years and he worked for Jensen Produce in Kimballton for a number of years. He was currently employed by the Elk Horn-Kimballton schools as a bus driver.

He was active in the Kimballton Fire Dept. for 24 years. He was also an active member of the Kimballton Commercial club and Progressive Danes. He died Friday, Dec. 12, 1980 at Myrtue hospital, Harlan at age 63 years.

He was preceded in death by one brother, Leland, who died as a child. Survivors include his wife, Mildred; two sons, Paul Andersen of Kimballton, and Roger Anderson of Honey Creek, seven grandchildren; two brothers, Graydon of Atlantic and Ivro of Shenandoah, one sister, Mrs Merle Brown of Des Moines, his step-mother, Mary Anderson of Exira.

Funeral services were held Monday, Dec. 15, 1980 at the Bethany Lutheran church near Kimballton with Pastor Douglas Kahl, officiating. Burial was in the Bethany Lutheran cemetery near Kimballton with Mervin Jorgensen, Harvey Christensen, Andrew Rudolph, Gary L. Anderson, Dennis Anderson and Larry Brown serving as casketbearers.
