Dorothy M. Boettger, 67

Dorothy Maxine Boettger, daughter of Roy and Bessie (Findlay) Havick was born May 30, 1918 on a farm in Center Twp., Shelby Co. She died at her home in Harlan, on Nov. 7, 1985 at the age of 67 years, 5 months and 7 days.

She attended school in Center Twp., and later went on to attend Cosmetology Academy in Co. Bluffs. She then worked at a beauty salon in Neola, and later owned

and operated her own salon in Harlan for 12 years.

On Dec. 1, 1949 she married Walter L. Boettger at Avoca. After they were married, they farmed near Shelby. On May 16, 1972, he died. She continued to live on the farm until 1974, when she moved to Harlan. This has been her home since that time.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband, Walter, and one nephew, Donald Sorensen. She is survived by one sister, Geneath (Mrs Harold) Sorensen of Springfield, Mo.; one niece, Charlene (Mrs Clinton) Hawkins of Longmont, Colo.; one nephew, Eugene Sorensen of Co. Bluffs and other relatives.

Funeral services were held on Tuesday, Nov. 12, 1985 at Pauley Funeral Home with Pastor George Gibson of the First United Methodist church in Harlan, of-
