Berneice Anna Butts, the daughter of Herman H. and Minnie (Husman) Meyer was born June 23, 1917, on a farm near Manilla, Iowa. She died November 2, 1989, at Jennie Edmundson Hospital in Council Bluffs, Iowa, having attained the age of 72 years, four months, and 10 days.

Berneice attended country school for a short time before attending school at Manilla, graduating with the class of 1936.

On June 2, 1942, Berneice was united in marriage to John W. Butts at Papillion, Nebraska. Two children were born to this union. After their marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Butts resided in Harlan where Berneice worked as a housekeeper. She later worked for Western Engineering for a while and then worked as a custodian for the Harlan Community School. She also cleaned house for several area people.
