Earling — Lela Carter, daughter of Charles and Elva Marco Knouse, was born on a farm in Shelby county near Harlan on Feb. 14, 1895. She attended Greenridge school in Irwin and Park school in Harlan. She homesteaded with her parents in Milestone, Canada, for five years and then returned to lowa where she made her home in the Irwin and Kirkman vicinity.

On March 20, 1919, she married John T. (Jack) Carter at Audubon. One daughter was born to this union. They made their home in Kirkman until moving to Harlan in 1946. This was their home until 1973 when they became residents of Little Flower Haven in Earling. After Jack's death in July of 1978, Lela continued to make her home at Little Flower Haven. She died at Jennie Edmundson hospital in Co. Bluffs, on Sunday, Sept. 9, 1979, at age 84 years, 6 months and 25 days.
