KIRKMAN - Chester Garfield Dahlof, son of Heimfred and Katherine Alwill Dahlof, was born on a farm in Polk township, Shelby county, on June 21, 1887. He died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan on May 19, 1975, at age 87 years, 9. months and 28 days. He grew to adulthood on his father's farm, attending Danway country school and at age 16 was baptized in Christat Redline. He has been an active member of his church since that time. On Dec. 25, 1907, he married Edith Maye Mitten at the home of her parents in Polk township, Shelby county. Two children were born to this union. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Dahlof farmed in Polk township until 1946 when they moved to Harlan. Mr Dahlof also was chairman of the A.S.C. Office in Harlan for over 20 years. Because of ill health, Mr and Mrs Dahlof became residents of the Baptist Memorial Home in Aug. of 1974.
