



Carrie Doonan, 87

IRWIN — Carrie Jensena Henrietta Doonan, daughter of Anders and Maren Nielsen Hansen, was born in Kansas City, Mo., on Dec. 11, 1892. She was baptized and confirmed at the Danish Lutheran church in Kansas City, Mo. She attended school and grew to adulthood in Kansas City. In 1908 Carrie moved with her parents to Kimballton.

On Feb. 21, 1917, she married John Doonan at Bethany Lutheran church near Kimballton. Three children were born to this union. They made their home on a farm west of Elk Horn, in Clay twp., where they farmed until his death in 1952. Mrs Doonan then moved to Elk Horn for several years. In 1960 she moved to Irwin, and in 1971 she became a resident of the Elk Horn Retirement Home. Mrs Doonan died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan on Friday, May 23, 1980, at age 87 years, 5 months and 12 days. She had been a member of St. Paul's Lutheran church in Irwin, where she was a member of the circle. She had also been a member of the Ladies Aid Society.

In addition to her parents and her husband, Carrie was preceded in death by one brother, Hans Henry Hansen; and one sister, Alma Petersen. Survivors include two sons - Earl of Harlan and Ralph of Audubon; one daughter - Edith (Mrs Norman) Scott of Manilla, seven grandchildren; and ten grandchildren; by a brother, A. Henry Hansen of Hampton; a sister, Marie (Mrs Viggo) Petersen of Racine, Wisc.; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at St. Paul's Lutheran church in Irwin, on Tuesday, May 27, 1980, with Pastor Emil C. Martinson, officiating. Burial was in the Jacksonville cemetery, with Ron Doonan, Mike Stangl, John Fiore, Alan Jensen, James Bayne and Russell Ahrenholtz serving as casketbearers.
