

THE LIFE STORY OF —
Venus S. Emory

ELK HORN — Venus Sybil Emory was born on a farm near Fremont, Nebr., on Oct. 29, 1892. She died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan, on April 12, 1977, at age 84 years, 5 months and 13 days. She was baptized in the Methodist church. She attended country school and grew to adulthood on her parent's farm. On March 6, 1911, she married Harry Emory at Fremont, Nebr. Six children were born to this union. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Emory made their home in Fremont. In 1918 they moved to Creighton, Nebr., and this was their home until 1948 when they retired and moved back to Fremont. After Mr Emory's death in Dec. of 1958, Mrs Emory continued to make her home in Fremont until 1961 when she moved to Harlan, to be near her son, Leon. In 1975 she became a resident of the Salem Lutheran Home in Elk Horn and this has been her home since that time.

In addition to her husband, she was preceded in death by her parents; three brothers; and by two sisters. She is survived by a daughter, Garnetta (Mrs Owen Couffts) of Creighton, Nebr.; five
