

# Julius Fischer, 91

Kimballton — Julius Fischer was born to William and Christine Sorensen Fischer, March 20, 1888 on a farm north of Walnut. He was one of 11 children born to this couple. On March 27, 1904, Julius was confirmed in the Evangelical Lutheran church, in Walnut. On Dec. 18, 1912, he married Anna Rasmussen. Anna and Julius farmed until moving to Harlan in 1947 where they lived until 1973. In April of that year Julius retired to Peace Haven Home in Walnut. Mrs Fischer died in Aug., 1972.

Julius came to the Salem Retirement Home in Elk Horn on July 7, 1975. He lived here until very recently when he moved to the Salem Nursing Home. It was here he died on Sept. 5, 1979.

Surviving him are two sons: Virgil of Port Angeles, Wash., and Gerald of Kimballton; two daughters: Naomi (Mrs Leon Christoffersen) and Alta (Mrs Glenn Petersen) both of Exira; six grandchildren; 16 great-grandchildren, one sister, Clara (Mrs Otto Christensen) at Peace Haven in Walnut; and one brother, Willie, at the Salem Home in Elk Horn. Preceding him in death were his wife, Anna; four sisters and four brothers.

Funeral services were held Saturday, Sept. 8, 1979 at 10:30 a.m. at the Peace United Church of Christ in Walnut with Pastor Bruno Romanowski officiating. Assistant Pastor was Harry Thomsen.

Burial was in the Walnut cemetery. Pallbearers were: Randy Fischer, Jerry Fischer, Clifford Fischer, Marvin Rasmussen, Dennis Larsen and Rodger Petersen.
