DALE C. GREEN, 68

Dale Clifford Green, son of Olive and Levi Green, was born Aug. 29, 1906 at Harlan. He died at his home Sunday, May 11, 1975 at age 68 years. The family moved to Coleridge, Nebr., where Dale finished his schooling. In 1931, the family moved to White River. On July 29, 1933 he married Anna Marie Watkins in Hartington, Nebr. This union was blessed with one son. In 1935 they moved to White River and worked. In 1937 they moved to Wenatchee, Wash., for one year, then returned to White River and worked in the bakery for Ben Burr until Dale purchased a White Eagle service station, which he operated for several years. In 1955 they purchased a ranch southeast of White River, operating it for three years. He then worked for Jay Carr Implement as an implement salesman. Dale then built and operated a laundromat until retirement. After retiring he helped on surrounding ranches, hunting and fishing. He was a member of the United Methodist church, Masonic Lodge, Yankton Consistory, Order of Eastern Star, Lion Clubs and an Honorary Fireman.

He was preceded in death by his mother and father, two sisters and one brother. Survivors include his wife, Anna Marie of White River; a son, Dennis, daughter-in-law, Josephine and grandchildren, Deborah Marie, Thomas Clifford and Johnathan Mark of Alexandria, S. D., his brother, Everett of White River; three sisters, Leota Shouldis of White River, Lois Mallum of Harlan and Vera Lindquist of Hamilton, Mont.

Funeral services were held May 14 at the United Methodist church. Burial was in the White River cemetery.
