

Henry G. Haberl, 74

Harlan — Henry Gerhart Haberl, son of Martin and Margaret Bauer Haberl, was born on a farm near Templeton, on April 1, 1904. He was baptized & confirmed at the Sacred Heart church in Templeton. He attended country school and grew to adulthood on his parent's farm. He then worked on farms for several years.

On Sept. 5, 1933, he married Rose Dozler in Granite Falls, Minn. Three children were born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed south of Manning until 1942 when they moved to a farm near Manilla. They retired from farming in 1971 and moved to Harlan. This has been their home since that time.

Mr Haberl died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan on Thursday, March 29, 1979, at age 74 years, 11 months and 28 days. He had been a member of St. Michael's church in Harlan.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by a brother, John and by a sister, Josephine. Survivors include his wife, Rose, of Harlan; a son, Gene Haberl of Los Angeles, Calif.; two daughters - Imogene (Mrs Francis McGovern) and Inez Ann Haberl, both of Omaha; and five grandchildren, by four brothers - Frank and Joe, both of Coon Rapids, Charles of Clarinda and Ben of Carroll; a sister, Marie Knobbe of Carroll; nieces and
