## Rose T. Haberl, 82

Rose Theresa Haberl, the daughter of George and Ann Vogel Dozler was born on April 2, 1903 on a farm near Templeton. She died on Wednesday, Aug. 21, 1985 at the ville de Sante Nursing Home in Omaha, at age 82 years, four months and 19 days.

She was baptized at Sacred Heart Catholic church in Templeton. Later she moved with her parents to Elgin, Neb., where she received her First Communion and was confirmed at St. Boniface Catholic church. She attended St. Boniface Catholic school in Elgin, and as a young girl moved with her parents to Oregon. After living there for seven years, Rose returned to Iowa with her parents.

On Sept. 5, 1933, she married Henry G. Haberl at Granite Falls, Minn. Three children were born to this union. After they were married, they farmed south of Manning until 1942 when they moved to a farm near Manilla. They farmed here until 1971 when they retired and moved to Harlan. On March 29, 1979, Mr Haberl died. She then became a resident of the Ville de Sante Nursing Home in Omaha. This has been her home since that time.

In addition to her parents and husband, she was also preceded in death by one brother, George.
