Bernhard Jacksonville Hansen, son of Magalene Eriksen and Rasmus Hansen was born Oct. 1, 1894 in Aeroskobing, Denmark. He died Feb. 8, 1980 at the Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan at age 85 years, four months and seven days. Bernhard was raised and educated in Denmark. In 1914 he came to the United States and settled in the Kimballton area. He joined the Army in 1918 and served during WWI. When he was 28 he moved to Jacksonville and started repairing and selling windmills and pumps.
