Norman John Hansen, son of John C. and Marie Andersen Hansen was born March 4, 1927, on a farm near Harlan. He was baptized and confirmed at Immanuel Lutheran church in Harlan, where he has been a life time member. Norman attended country schools in the Prairie Rose and Cuppy's Grove vicinities, growing to adulthood on his parent's farm.

On April 26, 1969, he married Frances Sick at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Harlan. To this union, three children were born. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Hansen farmed in Shelby County until 1975, when ill health forced Norman to retire and move into Harlan. This has been his home since that time.

Mr Hansen died at Mercy hospital, Co. Bluffs on Nov. 27, 1980, at age 53 years, 8 months and 23 days.
