

# Tony Heimerman, 78

**PORTSMOUTH** — Anthony Heimerman, son of John and Mary (Schleimer) Heimerman was born on a farm near Portsmouth on April 10, 1899. He died at Myrtle Memorial hospital in Harlan on Aug. 1, 1977 at age 78 years, three months and 21 days. He was baptized and confirmed at St. Mary's Catholic church in Portsmouth. He attended country school in Harrison co. and grew to adulthood on his parent's farm. Tony farmed in the Portsmouth area for a few years and later moved into Portsmouth where he worked at various jobs in that vicinity for several years. In 1954 he became a driller at the Schemmer Limestone Quarry in Logan. He retired in 1965 and moved to Logan. In 1977 he returned to Portsmouth and this has been his home since that time.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by a brother, John; a sister, Susan; and by an infant sister. Survivors include two sisters - Mary Heimerman of Harlan and Anna (Mrs Alois Bauer) of Shelby; a brother, Edward Heimerman of Harlan; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated at St. Michael's church in Harlan on Wednesday, Aug. 3, 1977 with Rev. Richard Wagner as celebrant. Burial was in St. Mary's cemetery in Portsmouth with Vernon Bauer, Cleo Anderson, Andrew Thraen, Elmer Heimerman, Robert Heimerman and Rudy Felgentreff serving as pallbearers.
