Harry Charles Henriksen, the son of Andrew and Stena Hansen Henriksen, was born August 8, 1896 on a farm in Shelby County, Iowa. He died in Myrtue Memorial hospital at Harlan, Iowa on June 4, 1972, having attained the age of 75 years, 9 months and 27 days.

He was married to Stella Petersen at her parents home on March 10, 1920 and they were privileged to celebrate their 52nd wedding anniversary this year.
