

Ella Hulsebus, 88

Defiance — Ella Hulsebus, daughter of William Marshal and Charlott L. Hannon Young, was born June 20, 1893 in Defiance. She was baptized as a young child at the United Methodist church in Defiance and attended school, graduating from the eighth grade. She grew to adulthood helping at her parent's home.

On Dec. 2, 1910, she married Rudolph Jacob Hulsebus in Denison. Four children were born to this union. After their marriage, they made their home on a farm one mile north of Defiance. This was their home until Mr Hulsebus died on June 15, 1973. She then moved to Fort Collins, Colo., to be near her children. This has been her home since that time.

Mrs Hulsebus was a member of the United Methodist church in Defiance for many years. She was also a former member of the Eastern Star, Irwin Chapter No. 182, O.E.S. She died at the Golden West Nursing Home in Fort Collins, Colo., on Monday, March 29, 1982 at the age of 88 years.

In addition to her husband and parents, she was preceded in death by one son, Bill, who was killed Oct. 9, 1944 while serving with the U.S. Navy during World War II; one granddaughter, Rebecca Dee Brown; five brothers, Lee, Melvin, William, Fred and J.B. "Burns" Young and one sister, Kate Hulsebus.

She is survived by one son, Fred of Fort Collins, Colo.; two daughters, Delila Jacobsen of Loveland, Colo.; and Una Belle Brown of Saginaw, Mich.; eight grand-

children, 7 great grandchildren and one great great grandchild; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at the United Methodist church in Defiance on Thursday, April 1, 1982 at 10:30 a.m. with the Rev. Russell Vanderhoef of the United Methodist church in Shelby, officiating. Burial was in the Union twp. cemetery with Steven Hulsebus, Bill Hulsebus, Leonard Ahrenholtz, Jim Young, Jim Jacobsen and Randy Jacobsen serving as casketbearers.
