Elliott C. Jorgensen, 79

Elliott C. Jorgensen, son of James C. and Martha E. (Johnson) Jorgensen was born April 3, 1905 at Harlan. Elliott attended school in both Harlan and Greeley twps.

After school, Elliott farmed for a few years.

On May 2, 1942, Mr Jorgensen was inducted into the U.S. Army at Fort Des Moines. He served his country during World War II in northern France and central Europe as a mechanic in the 3440th Ordinance Maintance Company. While in the Army he received Four Bronze Battle Stars, Four Overseas Service Bars and the Good Conduct Medal. After his honorable discharge, Oct. 17, 1945. Elliott returned to Harlan where he worked a short time for the City of Harlan and later for Western Iowa Pork but he worked most of the time as a self-employed plumber.

Elliott died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan on Thursday, Sept. 20, 1984, at

the age of 79 years, 5 months and 17 days.

In addition to his parents, Elliott was preceded in death by one sister Marie and five brothers Leonard, Dewey, Norman, Dale and Paul. He is survived by one sister, Helen Gloeckl of Belton, Mo.; one brother, Clarence of Omaha; nieces and nephews.

Graveside services were held at the Harlan cemetery on Saturday, Sept. 22, 1984, with Pastor Paul Olsen of Immanuel Lutheran church, Harlan, officiating. Burial was

in Harlan cemetery.
