PORTSMOUTH — Mary E.

Kelleher, daughter of Henry and Susan Reinig Greiner, was born on a farm near Portsmouth, on July 16, 1899. She died Oct. 2, 1975 at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan at age 76 years, 2 months and 16 days. She attended St. Mary's Catholic school in Portsmouth and grew to adulthood on her parent's farm near Portsmouth. She was baptized and confirmed in St. Mary's Catholic church of Portsmouth. Mary married Michael Peter Kelleher on Jan. 26, 1940 at St. Mary's Catholic church in Portsmouth. Mr and Mrs Kelleher were privileged to share 33 years together before his death on Aug. 2, 1973. After their marriage they lived in Portsmouth and this has been her home since that time. She was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church of Portsmouth.
