Harlan - Clara Marie Kloewer, daughter of Joseph and Catherine Blum Goetzinger, was born Aug. 17, 1912, on a farm near Templeton. She was baptized and confirmed at the Catholic church. Clara attended school in Defiance, and grew to adulthood on the family farm.

On Jan. 11, 1932, she married Otto Kloewer in St. Peter's church, Defiance. Ten children were born to this union. After their marriage they farmed near Westphalia for four years. They later lived in the Dunlap and Earling communities before moving to Harlan in 1962. This has been their home since that time. She was a member of St. Michael's church, Harlan, St. Michael's Guild, the Rosary Society and Catholic Daughters of America, St. Catherine's Court No. 266 of Earling. She died at Myrtue Memorial hospital on Sunday, Oct. 19, 1980, at age 68 years, 2 months and 2 days.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by one son, Robert and one sister, Helen.
