

## The Life Story of --

Mrs Daisy Larson, 91

**KIRKMAN** — Daisy Larsor was born on a farm in Jackson twp., Shelby county, on May 7, 1884, daughter of Taylor and Harriet Beems Plummer. She died Jan. 25, 1976 in Des Moines, where she had resided the past eight years. She was 91 years, 8 months and 18 days old. She attended country school and grew to adulthood on her parent's farm. She taught school in Jackson and Douglas twp. for a number of years. On Aug. 23, 1905, she married Marcus G. Larson of Kirkman. To this union four children were born. Mr and Mrs Larson lived on a farm east of Kirkman from 1905 until 1941 when they moved into Kirkman. Mrs Larson had been a member of the Methodist church in Kirkman for over 50 years and was a member of the Kirkman Ladies Aid Society. She was also a charter member of the Douglas Twp. WRS formed in 1910.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Marcus in 1964; her son, Melvin Dale, in 1931; four brothers and three sisters. She is survived by two daughters, Velma (Mrs Paul Willey) of Omaha, Nebr., and Mozelle (Mrs L. O. Nagel) of Des Moines, one son, Max Bernard Larson and his wife, Lois, of Fountain Valley, Calif., three granddaughters, Margaret Miller, Lynne Carr and Joan Butler and three great grandchildren; by a sister, Mrs Maude Miller of Baker, Mont., several nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Wednesday, Jan. 28, 1976, at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan with Rev. J. Elmer Brunk, pastor of the Kirkman United Methodist church, officiating. Burial was in Rose Hill Cemetery at Kirkman, with Russell Croft, Gerald Larson, Richard Johnson, Howard Larson, Jed Miller and O. E. (Buck) Holloway serving as casketbearers.
