Alma Anita Lee, daughter of Frank F. and Anna Katherine Noehren Klindt, was born June 8, 1901 on a farm in Monroe twp. in Shelby county. She was baptized and confirmed at the Walnut Lutheran church, attended the Monroe twp. country school, graduating from the eighth grade and then grew to adulthood on the family farm.

On Dec. 25, 1929, she married Virgil Lee at the Walnut Lutheran church. Four children were born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed in Fairview twp. in Shelby county. She later joined the Altamont Baptist church in Monroe twp. After Mr Lee died on Nov. 21, 1956, she continued to make her home on their farm until 1966, when she moved to Avoca, to live with her daughter, Velma. In 1979, she became a resident of the Baptist Memorial Home in Harlan.

As well as being a member of the Altamont Baptist church, she was also a member of the Ladies' Mission society. She died at Myrtue Memorial hospital, Harlan on Saturday, June 20, 1981, at age, 80.

In addition to her husband and parents, she was preceded in death by one brother, Carl P. Klindt and one sister, Evelyn Fischl. Survivors include two sons, Alvin of Ellendale, Minn., and John of Avoca; two daughters, Marilyn Lee of Sioux Falls, So. Dak., and Velma (Mrs Jack) Messenger of Avoca; eight grandchildren and one foster

grandchild; nieces, nephews and other relatives and many friends.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan on Tuesday, June 23, 1981 with Pastor Roger Porter of the Altamont Baptist Church officiating. Burial was in Cuppy's Grove cemetery, Shelby county with Max L. Klindt, David L. Klindt, Ralph L. Klindt, James L. Klindt, Lee W. Klindt, Sr. and Darwin R. Andersen serving as casketbearers.
