

Frank M. Leuck, 68

Harlan — Frank Martin Leuck, son of Michael Peter and Angela Greiner Leuck was born Feb. 3, 1913 on a farm northwest of Harlan. He was baptized, received his first communion and confirmation at St. Boniface church in Westphalia. After attending school, he helped on his parent's farm until he was inducted into the Army on April 24, 1942. He served his country during WW II as a Pvt. First Class and was stationed in several foreign countries. After receiving his honorable discharge on Sept. 11, 1945, he returned to Harlan where he was employed at Jacobs Tool Co. until he retired at age 62 in 1975.

He was a member of St. Michael's church and also a member of the V.F.W. Post No. 941 of Harlan. He died at Myrtue Memorial hospital on Sunday, March 8, 1981 at age 88 years, 1 month and 5 days.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by three brothers, Nick, John and Michael Leuck. Survivors include three brothers, Peter, Henry and Anton Leuck, of Harlan; six sisters, Anne (Mrs Lawrence) Entsminger of Preston, Minn.; Kaye Leuck of Harlan, Marie (Mrs Phil) Dolesh of Chicago, Ill.; Margaret (Mrs Don) Goede of Harlan, Sue (Mrs William) Milano of Denver, Colo., and Bernadine Leuck of Harlan; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

A Concelebrated Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated at St. Michael's church on Wednesday, March 11, 1981 at 11 a.m. with Rev. Richard G. Wagner as celebrant

and Rev. Vincent Ohlinger as concelebrant. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery with Verner Schmitz, Mike Petsche, Phil Dolesh, John Reisz, Charles Leuck and Russell Leuck serving as pallbearers. Military rites were conducted at the graveside by V.F. W. Post 941 of Harlan.
