the Life Story of -CARL M. MADSEN, 77

Kimballton - Carl M. Madsen was born Aug. 2, 1892 in Aggersborg-Thorup, Denmark, to Mads M. and Karen Andersen. He was baptized and confirmed in the Aggersborg church. Carl was a member of Immanuel Lutheran church in Kimballton. Carl came to the U.S. on Aug. 3, 1912, and came to the Kimballton area where he worked for Andrew Topp. He served in WWI. Carl farmed for many years with his brother Jens and in Jan. 1967, moved onto his present farm home one mile east of Kimballton. Because of his failing health Carl had recently moved into the Friendship Home in Audubon. He died Wednesday morning, April 16, 1975 at the Audubon County Memorial hospital. He was preceded in death by his

parents, four sisters, and three brothers. He and his brother Jens were the only two to immigrate to America. Carl is survived by two nephews here: Magne (Mac) Madsen, Kimballton and Thomas Madsen, rural Audubon and their families and

other relatives in Denmark.

Burial was in the Lutheran cemetery in Kimballton with Alan, Gary, Howard and Warren, Madsen, Mark Lange and Duane Hess serving as pallbearers.
