Defiance — Walter Kenneth Mahlberg, son of Joseph and LaVera Downey Mahlberg, was born in Panama on March 16, 1926. He was baptized and confirmed at St. Mary's church in Panama. He attended St. Mary's school and grew to adulthood in Panama. After graduating from St. Mary's high school in 1944, he entered the Navy and served until May of 1946 when he received his honorable discharge and returned to Shelby county, settling in Defiance where he worked for Don Goetz Trucking for several years.
