

## Hazel F. Marco, 85

Hazel Fern Marco, daughter of John and Cora Knouse Bamsey, was born March 19, 1897 in Center twp., east of Harlan. She attended the country school and also the school in Harlan, growing to adulthood in and around the Harlan area.

On July 26, 1922, she married Howard Ivan Marco in Harlan. Four children were born to this union. After their marriage, they made their home in Kirkman, until 1943, when they moved to Harlan. She spent most of her life working and taking care of her home and family. She worked as a cook at the Chicken Hut restaurant in Harlan for about 25 years. After retiring, she babysat for several families. After Mr Marco died on May 10, 1956, she continued to make her home in Harlan.
