Robert E. Maxwell, 44

Robert Eugene Maxwell, the son of Everett and Maxine Leu Maxwell was born Oct. 11, 1941 at Co. Bluffs. He died at his home in Harlan on Thursday, Dec. 12, 1985 at age 44 years, two months and one day.

He attended school at Emerson and Stenant, before attending Red Oak high school where he graduated in 1959. He then went on to train for a short time at the Automatic Pin Setter Machine Training Center in Chicago, Ill. After his training, he went to work at the Music Box Bowling Alley in Omaha, Ne.

On July 29, 1962, he married Betty Malcom at Red Oak. Later he went to work for the Penn Mutual Ins. Co. in Omaha. He also served six months of active duty in the U.S. Army and several years in the U.S. Army Reserve while working in Omaha. He also worked for a short time at the Alford Tire Co. in Omaha.

In 1971, they moved to Harlan, where he was employed at the Harlan Bowl. In 1977, they purchased the Harlan Bowl which they operated until selling it in July of this year. They have continued to live in Harlan since that time. He was baptized in the Methodist church and was a member of the Hawthorne Methodist church and the First Methodist church of Omaha, Ne., before moving to Harlan.

In addition to his wife Betty of Harlan, he is survived by two daughters, Cindy and Julie both at home; his parents, Everett and Maxine Maxwell of Mesa, Ariz.; two sisters, Marlene (Mrs Harvey) Lehman of Rockford, Ill. and Marian (Mrs Bruce) Bond of Ankeny; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held on Monday, Dec. 16, 1985 at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan with Pastor Dennis Brayman from the Congregational United Church of Christ officiating. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery, Harlan with Jerry Waltz, Neil Mahlberg, Mike Petsche, Willis M.
