Harlan — Charles DeWitt Maysent, son of George and Hattie Colburn Maysent, was born on a farm in Shelby county porn on a farm in Shelby county near Earling on Dec. 17, 1889. As a young boy, he moved with his parents to a farm near Panama. He attended country school and grew to adulthood on his parent's farm. After his father's death when Charlie was just 16, he and his mother continued to farm near Panama, until 1916 when they Panama until 1916 when they moved to a farm near Kirkman.

On Dec. 24, 1919, he married Martha Heilesen in Harlan. Three children were born to this union. After their marriage, they made their home on the Maysent family farm near Kirkman. This was their home until retiring from farming in 1948 and moving to Harlan. They were privileged toshare almost 59 years of marriage before Martha's death in Sept. of 1978. Charlie then continued to make his home in Harlan until becoming a resident of the North Ridge Care Center in New Hope, Minn., in Nov. of 1978. This has been his home since that time. It was here that he died on Thur-sday, May 10, 1979, at age 89 years, four months and 23 days.

In addition to his parents and his wife, he was preceded in death by an infant daughter, Donna. His survivors include a son, Charles of Kansas City, Mo., a daughter, Nadine (Mrs Don Floyd) of Minneapolis, Minn., eight grandchildren, four greatgrandchildren and other relatives

relatives. Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan on Monday, May 14, 1979, with Rev. Larry LaVelle, pastor of the First United Methodist church in Harlan, officiating.
