Cecile Minerva McConnell, daughter of Clark P. and Emily Longcor McConnell, was born June 30, 1909 in Harlan, where she attended school and grew to adulthood. She died at the Salem Lutheran Nursing Home in Elk Horn, on Febr. 5, 1974 at age 64 years, 7 months, 5 days. In 1927 she married Chris Nollen and they made their home in Harlan. Five children were born to this union. After an accidental fall, it was necessary for Mrs McConnell to move to Mrs Monson's home in Irwin in 1956.
