

**THE LIFE STORY OF —  
VALERIA MEISENHEIMER, 77**

Valeria (Scott) Meisenheimer was born August 23, 1898 at Carroll, and died at her home at Jacksonville, May 5, 1976 at age 77 years, 8 months and 12 days. She was the daughter of Dallas John and Alice Haley Scott. On Christmas Day, Dec. 25, 1921 she married Henry William Meisenheimer in Greenfield, Adair county. To this marriage three children were born. A stillborn son, Junior and two daughters, Georgia Evelyn and Phyllis Janet. Preceding her in death were her husband, Henry in 1945, two children, Junior and Phyllis and one grandchild, Pamela, her parents and three sisters, Bessie, Mary and Alice and three brothers, Charles, Harry and twin brother Verlie. She is survived by her daughter and son-in-law Mr and Mrs Arthur (Georgia) Rasmussen and granddaughter LuAnne of Nevada; two sisters, Mrs Ina Adams of Tuscon, Ariz. and Mrs Lee (Hattie) Crutcher of Hendersonville, N. C., nieces and nephews. After their marriage they lived on a farm southwest of Greenfield, until 1943 when they moved to Nevada, where they lived until Henry's death in 1945. In 1946 Valeria moved to Shelby county and has lived there until her death. She was a dedicated member of the Seventh Day Adventist church.

Funeral services were held at Bickford-Murray Funeral home in Greenfield, with burial in Fontanelle cemetery. Pastor Roger Cain of the Harlan Seventh Day Adventist church officiated. Nephews of Mrs Meisenheimer served as pallbearers.
