HARLAN — Mabel Gertrude Miller, daughter of John Franklin Green and Ada Altadelle Green, was born on a farm in Lincoln twp., Shelby county on Nov. 20, 1903. She attended eight years of rural school at Lincoln No. 4, just 40 rods from her parent's home and four years of high school at Harlan, graduating in 1922. She attended one year of college at Ia. City before teaching 6 years at the Lincoln No. 4 school. On Sept. 25, 1929, she married Warren F. Miller and lived on the Miller home place until the death of her husband in May of 1975. Since that time, she has made her home with her daughter, Marilyn in Schaller. She died Sunday, July 23, 1978 at age 74 years, eight months and three days, just one week after her grandson, Ronald's 9th birthday.

She was a long time member of the Tennant Methodist church, being an active member in the church until her illness. She served as president of the Ladies Society. She was a member of the Lincoln Social club, holding every office in the club. She did substitute teaching at the Tennant Consolidated school throughout the years it was operating.

In addition to her husband, she was preceded in death by her parents. She is survived by her son, Richard of Harlan; her daughter, Marilyn (Mrs Harold King) of Schaller; five grandchildren - Denise, Julie, Kevin
