THE LIFE STORY OF— Armella Monahan

PORTSMOUTH — Armella Catherine Monahan, daughter of Bill and Louise Horn Gubbels, was born on a farm south of Panama in Shelby county, on June 3, 1912. She died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan, on Jan. 10, 1977, at age of 64 years, 7 months and 7 days. She was baptized and confirmed at St. Mary's Catholic church in Portsmouth. She attended St. Mary's school in Portsmouth and grew to adulthood on her parent's farm. On Nov. 17, 1936 she married Cyril Monahan at St. Peter and Paul's church in Atlantic. Two sons were born to this union. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Monahan made their home in Portsmouth. This has been her home since that time. Mrs Monahan was a life time member of St. Mary's church in Portsmouth.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by three brothers - Herbert, Lawrence and Leo Gubbels.
