## Ronald N. Moon, 51

Ronald Neil Moon, son of Floyd and Verda Breitsprecher Moon was born in Monona on June 5, 1931. He attended school in Monona, graduating from Monona high school in 1949.

On Feb. 14, 1954 he married Jackie Smith at Elkader. Two children were born to this union. On Nov. 7, 1951 he was inducted into the Army and served his country during the Korean Conflict, as a Combat Infantry Man. He then went to work for the Elkader farm, a Farm Service as a bookkeeper and became manager in 1966.

In 1967 they moved to Charles City, where he was the manager for Farm Service Coop for two years and then moved to Harlan where he was the petroleum manager for the Farm Service Coop. This has been their home since that time.

He was a member of the Congregational Christian church in Harlan, Abu-Bekr Temple Shrine in Sioux City and Parian Masonic Lodge No. 321 of Harlan and currently served as secretary. He died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan on Saturday, Feb. 5, 1983 at the age of 51 years and 8 months.

He was preceded in death by his father Floyd. He is survived by his wife Jackie of Harlan; one daughter, Jill at home in Harlan; one son, Todd of Decorah; his mother, Verda Moon of Monona; one brother, Keith of Rochester, Minn., nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at the Congregational Christian church in Harlan, Monday, Feb. 7, 1983 with the Rev. Wayne Selsor, officiating.
