HARLAN — Ruth Chloe More, daughter of William and Maude (Wells) Freeman, was born in Emmetsburg on Dec. 20, 1904. She died at Mercy hospital in Co. Bluffs on Sept. 12, 1977 at age 72 years, 8 months and 22 days. Ruth attended school and grew to adulthood in Emmetsburg. She then attended Grinnell College in Grinnell, for two years before transferring to Drake University in Des Moines. After graduating from Drake in 1929, she taught school in Fort Dodge for a year. On July 27, 1930, she married Jake More at the home of her parents in Emmetsburg. Three children were born to this union. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs More made their home in Harlan and this has been her home since that time. Ruth was a long time member of the First United Methodist church in Harlan. She was a 50 year member of the Lebanon Chapter No. 8, O.E.S. and had been a member of the P.E.O. Sisterhood since 1934. She was also a member of Delta Gamma Sorority; the Delphian Society in Harlan; and the Myrtue Memorial Hospital Auxiliary.

In addition to her parents, Ruth was preceded in death by an infant daughter and by a brother, Clyde Freeman. Her survivors include her husband, Jake More, of Harlan; 2 daughters - Carolyn (Mrs Robert Baker) of Chicago and Mary L. More of Denver; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan on Wednesday, Sept. 14, 1977 with Rev Larry LaVelle, pastor of the First United church in Harlan, officiating. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery, with Stephen W. Arent, Dean Frederickson, Louis Jensen Jr., Martin C. Zaccone, William C. Campbell and Bennett Cullison, Jr., serving as casketbearers.
