

The Life Story of—

DR. F. W. MORGAN, 51

Francis W. Morgan, son of Floyd E. and Flossie Ann Coon Morgan, was born July 26, 1922 at Kansas City, Mo. He was raised and educated in Lincoln, Neb. He had been a physician in Ottumwa since 1952. He graduated from the University of Nebraska and the University Medical School at Omaha in 1949. He served his internship in Tacoma, Wash., and his residency in Chattanooga, Tenn. He attended the First United Methodist church, was a member of the Americal Medical Assn. Iowa State Medical Society, Wapello County Medical Society, the Elks Lodge, and the Ottumwa Country club. He was an overseas veteran of WWII and was a first lieutenant in the infantry. He married Patricia Anderson on Dec. 10, 1949 at Tacoma, Wash. Dr. Morgan was president of the Wapello County Medical Society at the time the county immunization clinic was originated and served as the medical adviser and clinic director. He died at the University Hospitals at Iowa City, Sunday July 21, 1974, following a short illness.

He was preceded in death by his father. Survivors include his widow; one daughter, Mrs Janet Lund of Westboro, Mass.; a son, Bruce at home; his mother, Mrs Flossie Ann Morgan of Ottumwa; and a sister, Mrs Theola Ann Carder of Deerfield, Ill.

Funeral services were held Wednesday at the First United Methodist church with Rev. Brown H. Garlock of Anamosa, a former Ottumwa pastor officiating. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery Wednesday, July 24, 1974.
