



Genevieve M. Mulvihill, 89

Walnut — Genevieve Mary Mulvihill was born May 8, 1890, near Platteville, Wisc., daughter of David and Lottie Jones Merry. She died Tuesday, Sept. 25, 1979, at the Salem Nursing Home in Elk Horn, at age 89 years, 4 months and 17 days.

She attended school at Laurens and graduated from there and the University of Northern Iowa and taught in Mont. and Wyo. She married John Mulvihill of Omaha in 1917, and they made their home there. After his death in 1929 she took graduate work at Creighton University, and taught in Co. Bluffs, Underwood, Carson and Havelock. She retired from full time teaching there, but was parttime librarian on the Havelock-Plover school and served several terms on the Board of the Havelock Public Library.

She moved to the Peace Haven in Walnut in 1973 and became a member of St. Patrick's church, the American Legion Auxiliary and the Republican Women's club.

Surviving are nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her husband, her parents, two brothers and two sisters.

Funeral services were held Friday, Sept. 28, 1979, in St. Patrick's church, Walnut with Fr. Paul Monaha, officiating. Burial was in St. Joseph's cemetery in Salix, with Dale McIntosh, and nephews, Clyde Merry, Floyd Henderson, Jerry Henderson, Clifford Merry and William Starrett serving as pallbearers.
