Harlan — Elsie Rosamond Nelson, daughter of Jens and Mary Christensen Larsen was born in Rorbeck, on July 22, 1906. At the age of two, she moved with her parents to a farm near Burke, So. Dak., where her family farmed and operated a blacksmith shop. In 1910 they moved to Tripp County, So. Dak., where they homesteaded and operated a blacksmith shop. This was her home until 1923 when they moved to Albuquerque, N.M., where her mother died and she moved to Harlan.

mother aled and Harlan. On Dec. 4, 1924, she married Clarence R. Nelson at his parent's farm near Harlan. To this union, three children were born. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Nelson continued to farm the Nelson family farm. They retired from farming in 1958 but continued to live there until 1963 when they moved to Harlan. In Dec. of 1976, they became residents of the Salem Lutheran Retirement Home in Elk Horn. Mrs Nelson was baptized in the Danish Baptist church and was a current member of the Grace Baptist church in Harlan.
