Lois F. Noble, 79

Lois Florence Noble, the daughter of John E. and Cora Shepard Noble, was born Aug. 8, 1904 in Harlan. She attended school in Harlan and graduated from the Harlan high school in 1921. After high school she attended Iowa State teachers college in Cedar Falls.

After college, she taught school at Modale for two years. She then moved to Perry, where she taught school for many years. In 1952 and 1953, she attended Librarian school in Nashville, Tenn. She then became the Perry high school librarian for many years. After retiring in 1969, she continued to stay active in the Perry schools and substituted for a short time. She then continued to make her home in Perry until this time.

She was a member of the Methodist church in Perry. She died at Bishop Clarkson Memorial hospital in Omaha, Neb., on Sunday, Sept. 4, 1983 at the age of 79 years and 27 days. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by two brothers, Dale and Russell. She is survived by her brother, Clifford of Omaha; nieces, nephews, cousins and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan on Thursday, Sept. 8, 1983 with the Rev. Robert M. Bell of the Methodist church in Perry, of-
